Tabunoki

("Japanese bay tree")



An evergreen tree that commonly grows near the coast. Its bark and leaves are used to make incense. Its wood is used in construction and furniture. It is often planted in parks.

Who eats it?



Aosujiageha

("common bluebottle")

Larvae eat the leaves.

Found between May

and August.
